WHAT IS IERN?

- IERN means International Energy Regulation Network
- IERN is a web platform for exchange of information about electricity and natural gas market regulation.
- Information on individual energy regulators around the world and their associations
- Provides key information on markets, market participants by country
- Reports on training opportunities, energy conferences and research tools for regulators

WHY IERN?

- Liberalisation, privatisation and regulation of the energy sector is developing worldwide
- In most countries new institutions have been created to govern the process: regulatory authorities independent from stakeholders
- There are differences in the economic and political contexts, but energy regulation is based on common institutional and technical features that can be shared
- Earlier World Energy Regulatory Forum emphasised that regulators benefit from dialogue, discussion and exchange of information

THE PILOT PROJECT

- Closing statement of Rome WFER II "...
 Forum's participants welcome the steps taken
 by the Forum's organizers to ...promote the
 establishment of an International Energy
 Regulation Network facilitating internet-based
 information exchange..."
- The Italian Regulator promoted and initially financed the pilot project of IERN

- An up-to-date section on world wide training, conferences and publications
- A section with information on all past World Forums on Energy Regulation

- Selection of 40 relevant world conferences /workshops on energy regulation and governance in the next 6 months
- The main 40 on-line journals on energy and regulation
- Selection of the most relevant papers in energy regulation available on-line (classified in 9 topic fields)
